Mothers should not be permitted to at candy, cake, pies and ald reason Tuberculosis. This dread disease has been known for centuries, but its nature has only been discovered in quite recent years. It is essentially a germ disease. It occurs most commonly between the afes of 18 and 35. Negroes, Indians and Chinese are most susceptible to it, and Jews the most free from it. It is found in all countries, while caused by germs that get lodgement within the body. Poor nourishment, overwork, bad ventilation, bad drainage and alcoholism are contributing causes. Hereditary plays a very insignificant if any part. One-fourth the deaths in the world between the ages of 15 and 30 are caused by it.

The germ is communicated from a diseased person to a healthy one through the medium of the sputa and generally no other way. A careful consumptive is no danger to his fellow man. A careless or ignorant one is a constant menace to those with whom he comes in contact. He should never spit on floors or sidewalks or in fact any place but in a receptacle which could be burned. Sunlight and a temperature of 100 degrees will destroy the germ.

There are two kinds of medical inspection complete where everything pertaining to the health of the pupil is taken into consideration, and partial in which only certain diseases of an infectious or contagious character are considered. The latter form is most commonly followed. The cost in American towns of this inspection is between 15 and 25 cents per pupil per year.
