It is an interesting and entertaining work, as  
the following extract from the preface will

"When the Author of the following little work  
died, it was not only 'published on Este,' but it  
was also the object of many fictitious admiring writers  
to assert, without any foundation whatever,  
that he would not be unmindful to assert, that  
the events of the narrative occurred exactly in the order  
and connexion in which they are related, and before  
the members of exactly such a family as is here described.  
Had this been the case, the production would  
have been merely a biographical treatise, with the  
real parties thinly veiled under fictitious names. Such  
is not the case; and yet there is no shadow,  
shame, or disgrace to describe an event of any importance  
harrowed, which is not an exact transcript of some  
character or event that occurred within the range of  
the Author's own knowledge. At the same time, it  
is hoped that the work contains nothing which, even  
were it divulged, could in the slightest degree prove

He, while both facts and feelings are, in very  
strict sense, true, the names of persons and places are  
intentionally and entirely fictitious in every instance  
but one. The name here referred to is that of her  
Royal Highness the Princess AUGUSTA, in the  
incident related in the last part of chapter 8. That  
incident occurred precisely as there related; and the  
Author thought it right to call the attention of  
those who might be interested to the fact, and  
humbly solicited attention to all around her, by  
which her Royal Highness is distinguished. Having  
in this one instance withdrawn the veil, he avers it,  
and states the reason,—hoping also to preclude the  
impression, that what remains more concealed  
may be of less interest. At the same time, it  
is hoped that the work contains nothing which, even  
were it divulged, could in the slightest degree prove  
offensive or painful to any person to whom it may  
be shown."
