CANADA'S PREMIER DYING.

During all last week Sir John Macdonald had been unwell. On Thursday morning Dr. Powell, his medical attendant called in Dr. Ross and Dr. Stewart, and after consultation issued a return to the effect that he had had a relapse of his attack of pleurisy and nervous prostration. On Friday evening he took a relapse and became unconscious and was not expected to live many hours. This was the message announced to the public on Friday afternoon by Sir Hector Langevin, when with much emotion he declared the announcement of the death of the late Premier.

SIR JOHN MACDONALD.

A GLEAM OF HOPE over Canada, and from the heights of grief for the veteran statesman who lies sick and death, in his home at Ottawa. His physical constitution, loaded with the weight of his long life, has succumbed; his body, which has done so much for his country, has failed; his work is done; and he is about to leave this world. THE MONTH'S MIND.

The anniversary Mass known as the Month's Mind for the late Bishop Murray took place in St. Dunstan's Cathedral today. The altar and choir were suitably draped in mourning, and a catalpa, surrounded by lighted tapers, stood in front of the high altar. Pontifical high Mass was celebrated at ten o'clock. The celebrant was the Most Rev. J. C. McDonald, Bishop of Charlottetown, with Rev. James Phelan as Archbishop. The deacons of honor were Revs. D. F. McDonald and G. De Finimmo. Revs. A. J. McDonald and E. Dingle were deacon and sub-deacon of office respectively. The masters of ceremonies were Rev. J. C. McMillan, D. D., and A. McVay. Rev. E. J. Gillis was Thurifer and Father McMillan and D. J. A. McDonald were Acolytes. The choir consisted of the choir of the Cathedral and the choir of St. John's. After mass an absolution was pronounced by His Lordship Bishop McDonald. Nearly all the priests of the diocese were present, and the priests from abroad in addition to those already named. The most Rev. Canon Carmichael, Halifax, and Rev. Father Bernard of the diocese of Portland Maine.

THE POPULAR MAJORITY.

NEWFOUNDLAND APPEARS TO HAVE OTHER BOUNDARIES.

NEWFOUNDLAND appears to have other boundaries than those which are now generally accepted. It is claimed that the boundaries of the province extend further east than is generally supposed. This claim is based on historical evidence, and is supported by many authorities. It is a matter of great importance, and one which should be carefully considered.

The Dominion fishery returns for the total value of the fishery for the year 1900 are as follows: Newfoundland, \$1,454,483; Nova Scotia, \$2,000,000; Prince Edward Island, \$1,000,000; Quebec, \$1,000,000; Ontario, \$2,000,000; Manitoba, \$1,000,000; Saskatchewan, \$1,000,000; Alberta, \$1,000,000; British Columbia, \$1,000,000; and Yukon, \$1,000,000.

AT THE PRESENT TIME.

At the present time the Canadian question are attracting much attention in other countries. The publication of Dr. Burinot's "Canadian Studies in Comparative Politics," cannot fail to be of much value. These studies, some of which were first delivered as lectures at Harvard, John Hopkins and Trinity (Toronto) Universities, appear in the form of a book, and are of great interest to all who are concerned with the development of the Dominion.

EDITORIAL NOTES.

The election which took place in the first district of Queens County, on Friday last, resulted in the return of Mr. J. P. McCreedy as the elected member.
