Colborne in 1836: SOME EXTRACTS FROM THE FIRST MUN CIPAL RECORD OF THE TOWNSHIP.

As we promised in our last issue we herewith present a few extracts from the first record kept of municipal matters in Colberne, which is furnished us by Mr. John Morris. The first meeting record-corded, as mentioned last week, took place at the primitive village of Garbraid, in the Orews and Anchor Hotel, on 4th Jan., 1836, "in the terms of Statute 5, Wm. 4th, 6.8." Mr. Daniel Lizzan filled the chair, and, as is duly recorded—not after the lashion of the present—there were present the following of the yeomanry, who probably represented a fair portion of the population: Copts.
