In the first of the e Major Lionel Conroy, of the Connaught Rangers, who was awarded a Distinguished Service medal in South Africa in 1900, was killed in a fight with outlaws near Wadai Hafii in the Soudan. Major Conroy was in charge of a contingent of an Arab battalion of the Eyptian army. In the second affair Lieut. Jones was shot through both legs during an attack on a stockade by Abyssinian raiders in British East Africa. When Jones was wounded all his soldiers except three orderlies fled. These men at Jones' command retook the stockade by as

WASHINGTON, To-Day. High officials of the administration believe the fortunes of the constitutionalist movement in Mexico hang largely in the balance, that only a clear explanation of the Benton incident and a satisfactory reparation will gain for them the prestige they had acquired as persons desiring the restoration of Constitutional Government in their country. Should the Benton case remain unsettled, in the event of the cause of the constitu tionalists being triumphant, there are strong intimations heard in official circles that Great Britain would re fuse to recognize Carranza if he was elected, and it is also taken for granted by officials that Britain might influence other Euro pean nations to withhold recognition until reparation is made for injury done foreigners.
