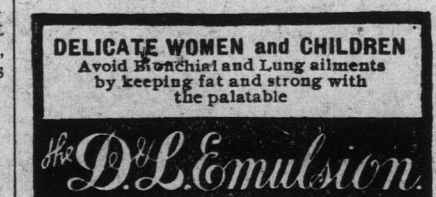
REACHED BELIZE.—The schr. Novelty, 41 days from this port, has arrived at Belize.

Belgrade Deserted

BY ALL FIT TO FIGHT.

London, Nov. 1.—The Budapest correspondent of the Morning Post sends a description of the City of Belgrade written by Margarete Veszi, a Hungarian correspondent, who says the city is practically deserted, only a few women and children being left. "The younger women have left with the men and are fighting with them," the story says. "Not even boys of twelve and thirteen can be seen. They are also in the firing line."

The city was badly battered, the outskirts of the town being demolished. Sentries were stationed before the shops to prevent looting. Many Serb soldiers were found hiding in the ruins, having been left behind in the retreat and watching for a chance to rejoin their comrades.

"Two soldiers are escorting a strange prisoner," the article says. "She's an old woman at least, seventy years old. With her hands securely tied. One of the men tells me she climbed a telegraph pole as cleverly as a cat and cut the wires before they had time to fire at her."

PEERS IN THE FIGHTING LINE.

A hundred and eighty-seven members of the House of Lords have been, or are, serving with His Majesty's forces; and to these must be added twenty-nine other peers not members of the House—four Scotch nobles and twenty-five Irish. As for the sons of peers, at present the known number is 434. Then there are sons of former peers or brothers of present peers. Of these there are 344. Directly and indirectly, the House of Lords and its families have contributed to the King's forces no fewer than 994 officers.
