

**NOTICE.**

Persons intending to engage in the manufacture of refined cod liver oil shall apply immediately to the Department of Marine and Fisheries for the necessary application forms, in order to procure their Licenses, which must be renewed from the first day of May in each year.

The Government have appointed as Inspectors Messrs. E. G. Coyell and M. B. Simonsen, who will visit all factories during the season to instruct and advise manufacturers in the best methods of refining cod liver oil; and it shall be the duty of all persons engaged in the said business to carry out the rules and instructions issued by the Inspectors aforesaid, otherwise they shall be guilty of a violation of the rules governing this industry, and in addition may have their Licenses cancelled.

The attention of those interested is directed to the following new Rule which will be strictly enforced:—

No package other than a new oak barrel made especially for refined cod liver oil, a tinned lined barrel, or a butter oil cask, shall be used to contain refined cod liver oil.


NEWFOUNDLAND PATRIOTIC ASSOCIATION EMPLOYMENT COMMITTEE.

The Employment Committee has been appointed by the Newfoundland Patriotic Association "to take into consideration applications for employment in civil life from returned Soldiers and Sailors of the Newfoundland Regiment and Newfoundland Royal Naval Reserve who have been granted honourable discharges." The Committee can only perform this duty to our returned soldiers and sailors with the fullest help and co-operation of all those in the Colony who employ labour or require help or service of any kind in which these men may be employed. The Committee will prepare and keep on file a register of all men seeking employment, giving their age, qualifications and experience, so far as possible, of each applicant. This information will be available to prospective employers, and steps will be taken to bring about interviews or correspondence between employers and soldier or sailor applicants. Every person or firm when requiring such help for either domestic or business purposes is therefore invited to communicate to the Committee the nature of the help required, and of the work to be done, and such other information as may be useful.

For the present the Headquarters of the Committee are at the Colonial Building, St. John's, and all communications should be addressed to A. E. Parsons, Secretary of the Employment Committee.
