Turkish Troops Hold the Heights Commanding Pharsalos.

Abdul Hamid Says He Feels Sorry for King George.

Restoration of the Statement That Greece Has Asked for Mediation by the Powers.

THE RECALL OF GREEK TROOPS FROM CRETE.

Athens, May 11.—The recall of the forces from Crete has been received with resignation by the public. The Delyannian organs attack the Government bitterly for appealing to Europe, but most of the papers are in sympathy with the Government, and the Ethnikos Hetairia, asking it to render an account of its policy.

On learning that the crown prince had appointed his dismissed chief of staff, Col. Sappas, and his aide, Capt. Harpertz, to the command of an artillery regiment, the Government has ordered them to return immediately.

GRECE SAID TO BE ASKING MEDIATION.

Athens, May 11.—It is stated that the Government has drafted a note to the powers, requesting mediation.

TURKS EXPECT TO TAKE DOMOKOS.

LONDON, May 11.—A Larissa dispatch says: The Turks have no doubt whatever as to the speedy capture of Domokos, although the place is fairly well defended. Edhem Pasha and his staff have gone on to Pharsalos.

The Daily Mail at Patras says: "Everything is ripe for a serious political crisis, or for a revolution. The army is disgusted, and the armed peasantry in universal discontent. The Greek National Society could not have a better opportunity."

PRINCE CONSTANTINE'S FATAL BLUNDER.

The Athens correspondent of the Daily Chronicle says: The scene of the Greek retreat to Pharsalos was the blunder of one who had been the crown prince's chief of staff, Constantine, who had been ordered to retreat to Larissa because he believed the exaggerated reports of danger. He had been ordered to retreat, but on the evening of the retreat, Edhem Pasha, despairing of breaking through the Greek lines, ordered his army to retire to Larissa, while the crown prince had dispatched a special commissioner to the Greek lines, with orders to surrender. The prince's army at the moment was simply pillaged and terror reigned at the Thessalonian front.

WALLED THEM UP.

A Terrible Crime in Russia, the Result of Superstition—Seventeen Hermits Perish.

LONDON, May 11.—According to a dispatch to the Daily News from St. Petersburg, a terrible crime, the result of superstition, has been committed at Tirozol, in the Government of Kharokov, where are a number of hermits, inhabited by sectarians. Recently seventeen of the hermits died, and it was believed that they had emigrated in fear of the impending day of judgment. But a more recent investigation has shown that they had been killed by a band of robbers, who had been hiding in the mountains for some time.

He Had \$50,000.

But He Starved to Death in New York.

Was Jilted, and Became a Misogynist, Miser and Recluse.

New York, May 11.—John Galner, the miser, of 412 West Twenty-fifth street, is dead.

Galner was born in New York 55 years ago, and when young was jilted by a woman. He then became a misogynist, and devoted himself to accumulating money in a news and cigar stand in Ninth avenue, near Twenty-fifth street. When his sister married 17 years ago he retired to his late apartments and subsequently gave up business and became a music teacher. He always lived in seclusion, and even his neighbors were never admitted to his rooms.

It was about 8 a.m. when groans aroused John Morrissey on the floor above him. They found Galner dying. They asked him if he desired a doctor, but he replied that he would not have one if the expense was great. Soon afterward he was sent to the hospital, where he died. The doctors said that semi-starvation and consumption were the causes.

When his squalid rooms were searched, a trunk was found containing what he was worth \$50,000. His heirs are two brothers at Croton, and John Delaney, home unknown.

Beginning of the End.

Collective Note on the Matter of Mediation.

Greece Agrees to Accept the Offer of the Powers.

Steps Taken to Stop Any Further Advance of the Turks.

Athens, May 11.—A collective note from the powers on the subject of mediation has been presented to the Greek Minister for Foreign Affairs, M. Skouloudis, by the Russian minister here, M. Onon, and it is said that the Greek Government has accepted the conditions imposed, and has confided its interests to the care of the powers.

TERMS OF THE POWERS.

The collective note of the powers is to the following effect: Upon a formal declaration by Greece that she will recall her troops and agree to such autonomous arrangements for Crete as the powers in their wisdom shall deem best, and accept unreservedly the counsels of the powers, they will intervene in the interests of peace. It was understood that Greece in her reply would assent to all of these conditions.

TO STOP THE TURKISH ADVANCE.

Active measures were taken at Constantinople today to stop the further advance of the Turkish troops under the command of Edhem Pasha.

MEDIATION ACCEPTED BY GREECE.

LONDON, May 11.—In the House of Commons today, Mr. A. J. Balfour announced that instructions had been received this morning from all the representatives of the powers at Athens, and Greece had been offered to the latter country, and had been accepted by the Greek Government.

THE WAR IS OVER.

Athens, May 11.—The diplomatic pour parlours, which have been proceeding all the morning, have been brought to a definite conclusion. Greece has formally adhered to the preliminaries of peace, as agreed upon between the powers, and the heads of the different legations have received positive assurances, investing them with authority to treat with Turkey.
