## THE WILLIAMS MURDER.

Continuation of the Coroner's Inquest at Cookeville.

COOKESVILLE, Jan. 5.—There was very little new in yesterday's evidence. Some sixteen or eighteen witnesses were examined, but they simply confirmed the statements which have already been published. The chief points were the further identification of the prisoner MacWherrell, and incidentally of Walker also, the tracing of the horse and cutter from the Armory Hotel on that Friday night until it was sold to Lowry, the Parliament street butcher, and the absolute establishing of the fact that Butcher and Walker were well acquainted before the horse deal on the Saturday following the murder and not strangers, as claimed by the former prisoner. It was also shown by the witness, Brown, and his sons that MacWherrell had originally announced his intention of staying with them until after Christmas, but that after reading the descriptions of himself in the Globe he suddenly left them without explaining his change of plans.

TORONTO, Jan. 5.—A rumor reached the city this afternoon that MacWherrell, in custody at Brampton on suspicion of being connected with the Williams tragedy at Port Credit, had committed suicide in prison by shooting himself with a revolver. Subsequently a dispatch was received from Brampton as follows:

"There is no truth in the rumor that MacWherrell committed suicide this morning."

The inquest will be resumed at 12:30 Wednesday next, when the crown will offer more evidence.

"Society" Circles in Toronto Deeply Stirred.

A Young Man Making 30 Cents a Day Secretly Weds a Daughter of a Wealthy Citizen.

TORONTO, Jan. 5.—Fashionable circles here are all astir over a secret wedding and marriage which, although it took place six weeks ago, only came to light to-day. The bride is Miss Helen Cook, the pretty 16-year-old daughter of Mr. John L. Cook, vice-president of the Cook & Bros. Lumber Company of Ontario. The groom is Walter Henry Cooper, a private at the new fort, a young man of 25, somewhat good looking. His father is an Anglican rector at Calgary, N. W. T. On the night before Thanksgiving Day Cooper and Miss Cook proceeded to St. Margaret's Church with one or two friends, and were married by Rev. R. J. Moore. The young lady went home and the young man to his routine duties at the new fort.

The alliance was not looked upon favorably, as the groom's income is only 30 cents per day. It is stated that reconciliation has been effected, and that the family are resigned to the situation, as the young woman has not shown any indication of changing her resolution to stand by Cooper.

The present intention of the family is to take a trip to England in the spring, where young Cooper will be placed in an English university to study medicine.

Mr. Cook is a wealthy man. He has only two children (daughters), consequently the bride will get half his wealth, which will be nearly \$500,000. Then the children of Mr. Cook and those of his brother, Mr. H. H. Cook, as well as the wealth of Geo. J. Cook. Altogether, it is said, the young bride is heiress to over \$1,000,000. The bride is one of the most handsome blondes in the city.

Cooper is well spoken of by everyone. His acquaintance with Miss Cook was formed accidentally. He passed the house almost daily to and from the fort and down town on errands.
