PERIL IN WOOD PULP

Journal of Commerce Sees Danger of Trade War.

New York, Aug. 7. - "Peril in Wood Pulp." This is the significant heading of an editorial article in today's Journal of Commerce. The retaliatory duty on wood pulp, the article declares, is aimed directly and obviously at certain provinces of Canada. Ontario prohibits exportation of pulpwood and Quebec imposes a tax a rebate when it is ground into pulp in Canada. As pulpwood and wood pulp and printing paper are imported into this country only from Canada, this is likely to apply to no other country, and as the restriction upon their export is undoubtedly intended to affect only that coming into this country, this may be regarded as "undue discrimination." Otherwise there would seem to be no meaning or effect in

these provisos. It is already intimated in Canada that the retaliatory duty on wood pulp may lead to the prohibition of its export altogether from that country in order to build up the paper industry, there; and if there is undue discrimination in the pulpwood, wood pulp, or paper charges, it would bring the country or the province concerned distinctly under the so-called maximum and minimum sections of the new tariff. Unless the President proclaimed that there was no such undue discrimination the additional 25 per cent ad valorem duty would have to be imposed upon all imports from Canada or the provinces having the discriminating charges. Then there would be serious peril to our trade relations with Canada, which would be foolishness in the worlds In fact, there is serious peril to trade in any policy of retaliation in tariffs. Is this what the reciprocity advocated by McKinley is coming to under

BOUNTY-FED IRON.

London, Aug. 7.—Respecting Canadian bounty-fed steel, the Glasgow ST. ALBAN'S A Church School Herald asks gravely: "Is it right, from an imperial viewpoint, that Canada should grant bounties on the production of material exported in competition with the mother country? Is it right that bountied Canadian iron should be shipped even to the mother country, if it is to be there sold against British iron?

> "This question of bounties on manufactures within the empire will have to be fought out. It should be one of the subjects taken up with earnestness at the next imperial conference."

Toronto, Aug. 6. - Dr. Wm. Brodie, provincial biologist, died at 5:30 tonight, after a brief illness. He was a native of Scotland, and was 78 years old. He was the oldest living graduate of the Dental College, and was the first president of the Toronto Reform Association. He was appointed biologist several
