CITY WILL STOP ALL WORK POSSIBLE

Only Such Local Improvements as Have Been Commenced Will Be Gone on With.

BYLAWS WERE ILLEGAL

Meeting of Special Committee Yesterday to Deal With City Solicitor's Letter on Improvements.

At a meeting of the special committee composed of Mayor Beattie, Ald. Richter, Tancock and Aspland and City Auditor Jewell yesterday afternoon to discuss the situation pointed out in the letter from the city solicitor in regard to local improvements, it was, on motion of Ald. Richter, decided to make the following recommendations to the council:

1. That the opinion given by the city solicitor be published in the minutes of the council.
2. That No. 2 committee be directed to discontinue all further local improvements which the city is not actually obligated to go on with through having commenced the work.
3. That the city solicitor be instructed to prepare bylaws to allow for the city's share of manholes and intersections, and for other local improvements which they have to pay a share of according to the act.
4. That in the case of sewers having an area of less than four square feet the minimum flange allowance shall be 120 feet; in the case of larger sewers the municipality shall bear that part of the cost provided for by the municipality.
5. That the special committee shall continue and shall confer with the city solicitor and city auditor in the preparation of the bylaws necessary.

Mayor Beattie pointed out that judging by the letter from the city solicitor the council has not been proceeding according to law in regard to local improvements.

"The only thing to do," he said, "is to call a halt at once and not go on with any work that we haven't got to." The other members agreed with this. Ald. Tancock asked what percentage of the cost of manholes and intersections amounted to, and Ald. Richter said that in the last five years it averaged 23 per cent.

SCALDED TO DEATH.

Pittsburg, July 26.—George Rosso was scalded to death in an ice cream factory on Fourth street early this morning. He was at work in a pit beneath a boiler when a steam pipe burst. His brother John, who witnessed the accident, sought to rescue him, but it was useless, and the man's body lay half an hour in the boiling water and steam before it was recovered and taken to the morgue.
