Face Trial.
Parry Sound, Oct. 22.—Jailer Dan-
iels, of Burk's Falls, has just arrived
here, having in charge Bruno Valle-
longa, the Italian charged with hack-
ing to pieces a fellow-countryman at
Lindsay recently, named Marie. The
prisoner had a preliminary trial at
Burk's Falls before Magistrate Charles
McArthur and was committed to Parry
Sound jail to stand his trial in the
charge of murder. The prisoner was
charged as an undersized man of about 5
feet 5 inches in height, and weighing
about 125 pounds, does not appear to
be such a fiend as his act would sug-
gest. He came to Canada from Italy,
via New York, eighteen months ago,
and speaks English. He is the wife
of a child in Italy. A correspondent
saw the prisoner on his arrival
and was present when he was registered
in the sheriff's office. He answered
