The governors intimate that the city is lacking in hospital accommodation, and that the conditions in the local institution are such as make it imperative to have a new building erected or the old one enlarged.

CHATHAM, Nov. 9.—The Women's Auxiliary of the Great War Veterans' Association passed a resolution Tuesday night to the effect that they did not want German-made goods in Canada, and sent a resolution to the Government asking that an investigation be made and all goods made in Germany be barred from Canada.

DISAPPEARS WHILE ON SHORT ERRAND

W. R. Ellison, Windsor, May Have Jumped Into River.

WINDSOR, Nov. 9.—W. R. Ellison, principal of the New Prince Edward School, is believed by the police, while suffering from nervous breakdown, to have jumped into the Detroit River from a Walkerville ferryboat some time Tuesday night. Though unwilling because of his condition, the result of a nervous disorder, Mrs. Ellison allows her husband to go unaccompanied to the corner grocery. He never returned.

Later a deckhand picked up an overcoat lying on the railing of the Walkerville ferry.

In an inner pocket several letters were found bearing Mr. Ellison's name, and a check for his full savings account made payable to Mrs. Ellison. This is the story which leads the police to believe that he jumped to his death into the icy waters of the Detroit River.

May Have Gone Away. Mr. Ellison's condition, following a breakdown a short time ago, was pitiable, his wife stated today. "I never allowed him to go out unaccompanied, but last night he insisted on just running down to the corner store for something I wanted. When he did not return within a few minutes I knew something was wrong."

Mrs. Ellison still believes that her husband may have left his overcoat on the boat and wandered away. The finding of the check made payable to Mrs. Ellison leads her to believe that he probably contemplated going away.

Police of all the border municipalities have been notified of his tragic disappearance, but they have not yet taken steps to drag the river.

THORNDALE, Nov. 9.—The sixtieth anniversary of St. George's and Grace Church, Thorndale, was held Sunday and Monday, November 6 and 7, Rev. A. Cummer, rector, preached at St. George's Church Sunday morning and selected for his text, "Speak With the Children of Israel That They Go Forward."

Rev. H. Ashby of London conducted the service in the afternoon at Grace Church. His text was "Arise and Let Us Go Hence."

Rev. W. L. Arncliffe of London preached at St. George's Church in the evening and took as his text, Joshua, xlii. 1, "There Remained Yet Very Much Land To Be Possessed."

The services were very impressive and special music was rendered by the choir.

On Monday evening a fowl supper was served in Harding's Hall and a play entitled "Confusion" was staged by the Dramatic Club of St. John the Evangelist Church, London. The proceeds from the Sunday services and the supper amounted to over \$400.

St. George's Church was erected in 1861, but during its rectorship of Rev. A. Cummer it has been remodelled and is today one of the most up-to-date churches to be found in any rural community. The total cost of remodeling was over \$5,000 which amount has been raised within three years.

COULD NOT PROVE LIQUOR STOLEN

Malahide Farmer, Therefore, Found Guilty of Selling Supply.

ST. THOMAS, Nov. 9.—Charged with disposing of a quantity of liquor in contravention of the temperance act, Roland W. Thayer, a farmer residing in South Malahide, was fined \$500 and costs today by the county magistrate. The fine was paid.

Mr. Thayer had purchased a consignment of whiskey amounting to 50 cases and valued at \$2,000, and the entire supply was found to have disappeared within two brief a period to satisfy License Inspector Ross.

The Humane Society has sent out warnings to farmers and others that unless their cattle and other animals are protected from the elements during the cold season, they will be prosecuted. Complaints are coming to the society's inspector that some animals are not receiving sufficient food and water and are not sheltered.

Filling up on a concoction of beef, iron and wine, balsam, honey and bay rum, landed Charles Lock and Isaac Williams in the police dock today and they were fined \$55 and costs each, with the alternative of spending Christmas holidays with Governor Linton. The recipe was new one to Chief Armstrong, but the accused assured the court that when well shaken it knocks the home-brew sideways.

REEVE PLANT WILL NOT BE CANDIDATE

North Essex Conservatives To Hold Second Convention Thursday.

WINDSOR, Nov. 9.—When Thomas Plant, reeve of Maldenstone, and former warden of Essex County, this afternoon announced he would not contest North Essex in the interest of the Conservative party, the Border Tories still without a standard-bearer.

"I have decided not to enter politics at present," Reeve Plant told The Advertiser over a long distance. Dr. R. D. Morand, president of the North Essex Tory organization, may be nominated Thursday afternoon at the second convention of the party in the Oddfellows' Temple, Windsor.
