## WILL CONFER ON UNIFORM LAWS

Complete Program For Fifth Annual Conference At Vancouver.

Commission Comprises Three

From Each Province Except Quebec.

VANCOUVER, B. C., July 11 .- (By Canadian Press).-The program has been completed for the fifth annual conference of commissioners on the ! uniformity of legislation in Canada, whose sesoons will occupy four days prior to the convention of the Canadian Bar Association here on Aug.

During the first two days the commissioners will meet in Victoria, and the final two days in Vancouver.

The commission comprises three representatives from each province, is limited to one. The distinction in the case of Quebec is due to the difficulty of harmonizing the Frenchthose of the English-speaking prov-

The president of the conference is Sir James Aikins, K.C., lieutenantgovernor of Manitoba, and president of the Canadian Bar Association. The conference met for the first time in Montreal on Sept. 3, 1918, the next year in Winnipeg, and the ensuing two years in Ottawa.
