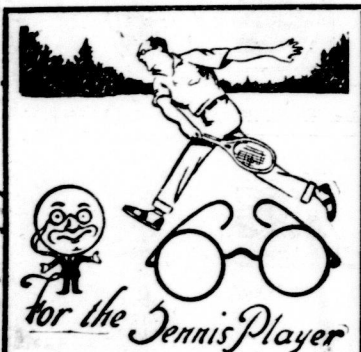

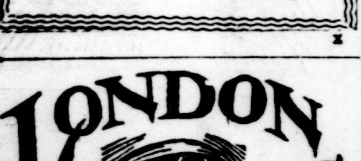

ASKS FREEDOM FROM ASYLUM

Wealthy Montreal Woman Charges She Was Kidnapped On City Street.

Defense Claims Her Only Offense Was "Communicating With Spirits."

MONTREAL, July 11.—Sir Conan Doyle, Flammarion and other world-renowned spiritualists will be invoked in defense of Mrs. Ernestine Menard, wife of Yvon Lamontagne, a Montreal lawyer, who complains that last Wednesday she was attacked by three men on the public street, gagged, thrown into an automobile and driven off to an asylum at Longue Pointe.

Mrs. Lamontagne's only offense, according to the record put into court by the defense, is that "she communicated with the spirits."

The case has all the elements of a cause celebre, for, not only is the complainant a wealthy woman in her own right, but her family is one of distinction in the city. Her father, having been a renowned architect, builder of the Montreal court house and of several large Catholic churches, while through their marriages her sisters are also well connected.

Mrs. Lamontagne has petitioned, through her lawyer, Pierre Ledieu, K.C., for the issue of a writ of habeas corpus on which she might plead before the court for liberation from the institution in which she claims she is now being detained illegally and against her will.

Habeas Corpus Writ.
The application was heard before Justice Lafontaine in the superior court, and the judge ordered the writ of habeas corpus to issue against the authorities in charge of the asylum to bring the petitioner to court and state on what authority

they detained her against her will.

Mrs. Lamontagne was accordingly brought to court yesterday, before Justice Martineau, who postponed the case till Thursday, meantime ordering the asylum authorities to take the greatest care of the petitioner and treat her as if she were a free woman.

The story of the kidnapping of Mrs. Lamontagne was told today by her lawyer, Mr. Ledieu, who said that on July 3, as she was returning from a visit to her sister, she was pounced on by three unknown men who gagged her, carried her into a waiting automobile and drove her off to Longue Pointe, where she was placed in an asylum.

There had been no court proceedings against the petitioner, and her abduction was characterized by counsel as illegal in view of the fact that she is sane, according to the contention.

It appears, however, that Mrs. Lamontagne's commitment to an asylum was legal in the sense that the law stipulates that a person can be committed to an asylum on the written authority of two medical men, and a certificate of insanity was given by the husband by Dr. Chagnon and Dr. Dupont.

The civil code of Quebec, however, orders that, in the event of such a certificate being given, the procedure is to call a family council and, after discussing the affair, bring it before the court, the presiding judge of which will hear the evidence produced by the family council, and order a commitment to an asylum if he agrees that the complaint is justified.

In this case no such procedure was adopted. It is alleged, and Mr. Ledieu, the petitioner's counsel, claiming that the petitioner is in her right mind, argues that the commitment under such circumstances is barbarous and unworthy of a civilized country.

"It is worse than the days of the Bastille," he said. "Even the king has no right to commit a person without a charge against them, and what is an asylum but a jail?"

FORM \$1,000,000 RADIO CONCERN

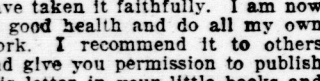

WILL CONFER ON UNIFORM LAWS

Complete Program For Fifth Annual Conference At Vancouver.

Commission Comprises Three From Each Province Except Quebec.

VANCOUVER, B. C., July 11.—(By Canadian Press).—The program has been completed for the fifth annual conference of commissioners on the uniformity of legislation in Canada, whose sessions will occupy four days prior to the convention of the Canadian Bar Association here on Aug. 16.

During the first two days the commissioners will meet in Victoria, and the final two days in Vancouver.

The commission comprises three representatives from each province, except Quebec, whose representation is limited to one. The distinction in the case of Quebec is due to the difficulty of harmonizing the French-Canadian law, or Code Napoleon, with those of the English-speaking provinces.

The president of the conference is Sir James Aikins, K.C., lieutenant-governor of Manitoba, and president of the Canadian Bar Association.

The conference met for the first time in Montreal on Sept. 3, 1918, the next year in Winnipeg, and the ensuing two years in Ottawa.

provinces to place on the statute books a uniform law regarding legitimation by subsequent marriage, and has made uniform the bulk sale, the sale of goods and partnership acts.

The conference fire insurance act is expected to be adopted by the British Columbia Legislature at the next session.

At the August meeting reports will be received from the Ontario committee on a uniform life insurance act, from the Saskatchewan committee on the duration of estates from the British Columbia committee on the reciprocal enforcement of judgments and also conditional sales; from the Alberta committee on wills and mechanic liens; from the Nova Scotia committee on succession duties; from the Manitoba committee on companies; from the New Brunswick committee on workmen's compensation; and from the Prince Edward Island committee on fraudulent conveyances.

These matters are, in nearly all instances, dealt with by the provinces in their own laws, and the object of the conference is to make these laws uniform, and so avoid confusion and contribute to convenience.

The British Columbia members last year submitted a report on the protection of property rights of married women, and this report is to be again considered at the August meeting.

The intention in drafting a uniform life insurance act is primarily to make uniform the conditions attached to life insurance policies.

BRITISH PREPARE FOR BIG TWELFTH

Signs of Unrest Prevail As Boyne Celebration Approaches.

LONDON, July 11.—Flags were everywhere in evidence tonight in preparation for tomorrow's Orange commemoration of the Battle of the Boyne between the Williamites and Jacobites in 1690. Pictures of Field Marshal Sir Henry H. Wilson, who was assassinated in London about three weeks ago, are conspicuous in the decorations.

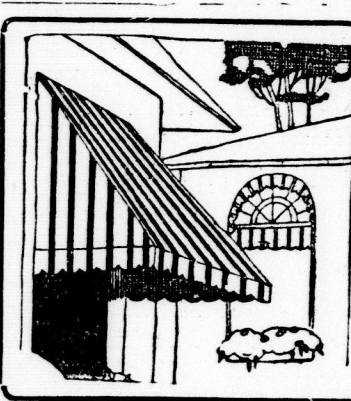
At all the demonstrations in the provinces resolutions will be put forward condemning in the strongest manner possible all unlawful acts of violence, deploring the anarchy prevailing in the greater part of Ireland, expressing alarm at the jeopardy in which lives and property of co-religionists in South Ireland are placed, and demanding that adequate steps be taken at once to secure peace and security, and calling upon the Northern government to adopt without delay all possible means to secure the safety and integrity of the six counties against all aggression. The resolutions will pledge support to the government to achieve this end.
