A DENTAL DISCOVERY COMES FROM ONTARIO

Toronto, Jan. 10.—Elimination of danger of abscesses at the roots the danger of abscesses at the roots of the teeth, which is responsible for a variety of ills ranging from rheumatism to eye trouble, is expected to be the result of research work which has been carried out for five years at the University of Toronto, and which is only now revealed. The new discovery consists of using copper amaleam as a permanent filling for the root canals of the tooth. This has been used before as a filling for teeth, but, until the research work at the University, it was not known to have permanent germicidal effect.
