alonist and Liberal Election Agents Throughout Scotland Have Been Warned to Be in Readiness, As Dissolution Is Anticipated Within Thirty

LONDON, Feb. 22 .- According to the cotch Unionist press the Conservative Unionist and Liberal election agents have been warned that a dissolution of Parliament will without doubt occur within 30 days, and instructions have been given to make preparations for a new election. It is also said Mr. Gladstone will probably not stand for re-election, in which case Sir James Carmichael will doubtless be the Liberal candidate for the Midlothian seat upied by Gladstone since 1880.

LONDON, Feb. 22.-Mr. Patton, formerly banker in New York, has been nominated Gladstonian candidate for the constituency of St. Andrew's Burghs. In the last genera election this constituency was won by the Liberal-Unionists by a majority of 112.
