Railway Passes.

There is a member of the Quebec House who believes that riding on railways free of charge is the legitimate right of all members of the Legislature, and with this in view Mr. Bissonette, who sits for Standstead, recently introduced a bill to that effect. He doesn't want to ride by "courtesy" of the railway, but by right of his occupying the position he does. He explains in his measure that the Legislative councillors and members of the Legislature no longer receive a mileage allowance, and in lieu to this he wants the railways operating within the province to make good the deficiency. This same question was brought up some years ago in the Federal House by the member for South York, Mr. Maclean's argument being that when railways now issue passes to members it is a species of bribery, whereas if it was a matter of law or rather custom, the bribing feature would cease to exist. As it now stands, members of the Federal House may utilize a railway pass and then charge up their mileage, which the Government pays. They collect from the railways on the one hand and from the Government on the other. As a matter of fact, there appears only one way out, and that is to pass laws which will prevent the railways giving passes to members of the Legislatures, the Federal House, the Senate, or to any one connected with the Governmental services, either Provincial or Federal. It is a low, cheap, species of bribery on the part of the railways, and pilfering and petty larceny on the part of our Governmental bodies that should cease.—Saturday Night.

S. Leckie.

Something like half a century ago three eloquent young Irishmen crossed the Atlantic to serve the Church of England in Canada. Strong men they early became influential forces in the new country. Two of them served in the rectorship of St. James' Cathedral, Toronto, and all three attained the rank of Bishop. The Right Rev. John Phillip DuMoulin, Bishop of Niagara, died Wednesday morning, Bishop Sullivan and Bishop Carmichael having preceded him some years.

Bishop DuMoulin was one of the most logical and powerful preachers this country has heard. Absolutely fearless in the pulpit, he never hesitated to condemn the sins and extravagances of the day. As Canon of St. James', he drew people of other denominations and his Lenten services were listened to by large mid-day congregations of many persuasions. Into the wider field of the See of Niagara he carried the same convincing eloquence, and the same energy and fearlessness. A grand old man, he was a fervent patriot. Always he feared God, honored the King, and served the State through the Church.—News.

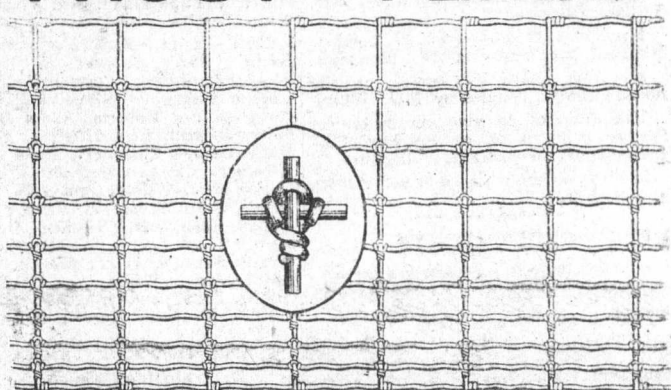
