### DEATHS OF DUFES

MAY REACH 10,000

"Doctor George Sutcliffe, Albany, Found at Last."

Hartford.—Wholesale indictments of quack doctors for manslaughter as one result of the Grand Jury investigation were predicted by two officials. State Health Commissioner Osborne announced that a painstaking examination of all death certificates in Connecticut for five years is revealing an immense total signed by alleged quack doctors. More than 200 of these, he said, would be turned over to the Grand Jury Monday.

Big Job To Investigate. Dr. Osborne, who was ordered by the Grand Jury to select from the official records all suspicious certificates or anything indicating potential manslaughter, said he had a special staff of clerks on this task and added:

At least ten days will be required to examine all the cards, and the Grand Jury may run into the thousands. There is no exact method of estimating the number because some of the doctors have been in Connecticut five years. Also I am finding more death certificates from some than others."

Dr. George F. Sutcliffe was located at the Bond Hotel annex, where he is staying with his brother-in-law, F. M. Dubois, of Albany. He is wanted on a manslaughter charge based upon his care of other to Albert C. Hoody, who came to his office with a crushed finger, and died an hour later on Sutcliffe's operating table.

Sutcliffe, who fled from Albany to Toronto, escaped Canadian officers by only two hours. He has confessed to Gov. Templeton and other state officials.

10,000 Deaths Estimated. On the basis of one death a month confessed by Sutcliffe, 200 deaths during the last five years would have signed more than 10,000 death certificates. Whatever the number, the Grand Jury proposes to scrutinize each carefully, according to Foreman Holden.

Dr. Sutcliffe is available for the Connecticut extraordinary grand jury any time it sees fit to call him to testify. State Attorney Hugh M. Aldern announced this information following a conference with Benedict M. Holden, foreman of the grand jury, and County Detective Edward J. Hickey.

"There are certain reasons why I cannot make public the whereabouts of Dr. Sutcliffe," said the State's Attorney. "All I can say is that we have him and that he is ready for the grand jury."

### WOODMEN'S WAGES

Small Operators Affected by High Rates.

While the high prices being paid for woodmen is a good thing for those who have secured employment with the larger operators, the rates of wages, \$75 and \$80 a month, have proved a stumbling block for the small operators. Hon. J. E. Michaud on Friday explained that owing to the high wages, many woodmen in the North had refused to work for small operators for less money than was offered by the lumbermen who do business on a large scale. A considerable number of New-Brunswick-ers had crossed the line and gone to work on the American side. This had made it impossible for some of the smaller operators to carry on business and next Summer it might be that the small mills would not be able to engage in manufacturing. Unless that danger was obviated, it would mean that there would be no work for many next Summer.—St. John Globe.
