In accordance with notice given at the January Session, the Grand Scribe moved the reconsideration of the following resolution adopted at that meeting:

"That the application from "Vesper" Division asking this Grand Division for power to allow said Division to pass a bye-law, allowing youths between 14 and 18 years to vote in accordance with the Constitution be complied with."

Seconded by Bro. C. E. DeWolfe and agreed to unanimously.

The Grand Scribe moved, seconded by the Grand Chaplain; That, the further consideration of the resolution be deferred until the annual meeting in November next.

Agreed to unanimously.

P. G. W. P. Taylor moved, seconded by J. P. Armstrong of No. 208, *That*, 500 copies of the Journal of Proceedings at this Session be published.

Agreed to.

On motion, votes of thanks were passed to the Manager of the Windsor and Annapolis Railway, and the Superintendent of the Provincial Railways, for reducing fares, over the roads named, to Representatives attending this Session; to Olive Branch Division S. of T., and Resolution Lodge, B. Templars, for use of their Hall during the present Session; and to the friends in Bridgetown for the hospitality extended by them to Representatives from a distance.

Minutes of this sitting were read and approved.
