



IN WITNESS WHEREOF the undersigned, being duly authorized thereto by their respective Governments, have signed this Treaty.

ARTICLE VIII

Entry into Force and Termination

1. This Treaty shall enter into force thirty days after the Contracting States have exchanged notifications that the legal requirements for its entry into force have been met.
2. Either Contracting State may terminate this Treaty by notice in writing at any time and it shall cease to be in force on the one hundred and eightieth day after the day on which notice is given.
3. Subject to paragraph 3 below, on entry into force of this Treaty, the Treaty between Great Britain and Spain for the Surrender of the *Fort of Sagunto*, signed at London on June 4, 1878, as amended by the Declaration signed at Madrid February 17, 1899 amending Articles II and VI of the Treaty, shall cease to have effect between the Contracting States.
4. Reservations requested after the entry into force of this Treaty shall be governed by its provisions.
