PRAYERS.

20 Petitions were laid on the Table.

Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—

Copy of correspondence with the Dominion Government respecting the transfer of Natural Resources to the Province of Manitoba.

Also,—Copy of Order in Council, P.C. 1258, dated 1st August, 1928, respecting the same.

Also,—Copy of correspondence with the Dominion Government respecting the transfer of Natural Resources to the Province of Saskatchewan.

Also,—Copy of correspondence with the Dominion Government respecting the transfer of Natural Resources to the Province of Alberta.

And also,—Copy of correspondence between the Honourable S. F. Tolmie, Premier of British Columbia, and the Prime Minister of Canada respecting the transfer of Railway Lands and Peace River Block to the Province of British Columbia.

He also laid before the House,—Copy of the General Treaty for the Renunciation of War, signed at Paris, August 27, 1928.

By leave of the House, on motion of Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), it was ordered,—That 1,000 copies in English and 500 copies in French of the General Treaty for the Renunciation of War, signed at Paris on the 27th August, 1928, tabled to-day, be printed forthwith, and that Standing Order 64 be suspended in relation thereto.

Mr. Mackenzie King (Prince Albert), a Member of the King's Privy Council, laid before the House,—Copy of Convention and Protocol between Canada and the United States for the preservation of Niagara Falls by the construction of remedial works and for the experimental withdrawal of additional water from the Niagara River, signed at Ottawa, January 2, 1929.
