(1) With respect to the petition of R. M. Willes Chitty and others, of Toronto, Ontario; praying to be incorporated under the name of "Universal Eucozone Limited."

(2) The Committee find that the notice of intention to apply to Parliament has been published once a week for three consecutive weeks, whereas Rule 107 requires publication once a week for five consecutive weeks.

(3) The Committee is satisfied that no interest will suffer if the Bill is allowed to proceed and beg to recommend that publication of the notice for three weeks be deemed and taken as sufficient compliance with the requirements of Rule 107.
