between the three services—army, navy and air force; the total grants appear, with the combined total of administration costs and total grants for each committee. The total expenditures are given in the right hand column. Then there is shown the total of recurring grants, that is to say, grants which have been authorized, in the same manner as pensions for definite periods at the rate of so much a month. That total is shown for the dominion as a whole. The total of the recurring grants is \$131,000.

If the committee is satisfied I will file this statement, which will give the information

needed. To give an idea of what has been disbursed in grants, the amount from January 1, 1942 to November 31, 1943, is \$2,054,-920.38. The total expenditure for that same period, including administration expenses as well, is \$2,548,707.36. That is for two years less one month. It includes only cases actually settled or, as the chairman says, put through the books; but it does not include the many cases in transit which are being dealt with currently, or the grants paid locally and not yet recorded at headquarters.
