COMMITTEE STUDY OF CODFISH QUOTAS IN GULF OF ST. LAWRENCE—MOTION UNDER S.O. 43

Mr. Herb Breau (Gloucester): Mr. Speaker, under the provisions of Standing Order 43 I ask for the unanimous consent of the House to introduce a motion dealing with an important matter of urgent necessity.

In view of the unfortunate decision of the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans (Mr. McGrath) to increase codfish quotas in the 4T and 4VN areas of the Gulf of St. Lawrence and to allow boats of 100 feet and over to fish 6,000 metric tons of cod, which will have disastrous consequences for inshore fishermen and those who depend on the fisheries of the Gulf for their survival, I move, seconded by the hon. member for Gaspé (Mr. Cyr):

That the committee on fisheries and forestry be set up at once and that the House refer the matter to the committee so that the minister may explain his decision which favours the companies at the expense of the independent fishermen and that the fishermen of the Gulf may show to the committee the effects of that irresponsible decision.

Mr. Speaker: Order. The House has heard the motion of the hon, member. Under the provisions of Standing Order 43, such a motion requires the unanimous consent of the House. Is there unanimous consent?

CALL FOR LEGISLATION TO PROVIDE PRORATA PENSIONS FOR CERTAIN WIDOWS—MOTION UNDER S.O. 43
