You will doubtless recollect my calling upon you earlier in the year and informing you of the plans of the University regarding the extension of the Department of Electrical Engineering.

As a result of the various interviews I had with gentlemen interested in electrical work it was decided to proceed with the development and in view of certain substantial contributions received from the Montreal Light, Heat & Power Company and the Shawinigan Company I was authorized to arrange for the construction of a new wing of the Engineering Building. The premises thus becoming available will enable this University to install an electrical equipment equal, I hope, to any on the continent and the convenient proximity of the mechanical and hydraulic departments will ensure that the young engineers who leave McGill will be able to maintain the high traditions of the University.

I feel that in this extension of the Electrical Department we are making preparations to do still more effective service in training men for work with such companies as yours.
