A new clause in the bylaws permits persons 50 years and over, who are found ineligible for the gratuity fund, to become members on payment of \$25 entrance fee and the fees of the then current year. These members will not be subject to gratuity fund assessments. In the conversation, which President Wilkie declared in order, Mr. W. B. Hamilton doubted that the gain made in the sale of life memberships would be more than counterbalanced by the loss in yearly fees. Suppose 100 life memberships were sold at \$20,000. The interest on that amount would be \$1200, while the loss of annual fees would amount to \$1700. He did not think this a good method of paying up the current indebtedness of \$15,000.

Vice-President Blain stated that the current indebtedness was not \$15,000; in fact,
