to account for, unless the Cartesian System, fo long exploded in Philosophy, should be allowed to hold good in Politicks, and then the Activity of the French Tourbillon makes the matter plain. I beg your pardon for this Fargon. The Subject is serious, and the Conduct of that State in the present Crisis, too important to be treated with Levity.

I Could indulge my Melancholy a little longer in contemplating the troubled Scene, both at Home and Abroad; but the Inquiry into the Revenue, Credit, and Commerce of France being finish'd, my Task of writing is at an end. I only beg leave to assure you, that Truth and Exactness have been my principal Care, and they are the only Merit of a Performance of this nature. If it meets with your Approbation, it is all I aim at; for without Flattery there is no Man Idesire more to please.
