

The operation of the above regulation is limited to 320 acres.

The rate of duty on stock in excess of the above numbers is 20 per cent.

BRITISH COLUMBIA TO THE YUKON.

If I want to go on to the gold fields in British Columbia or to the Klondike, or any part of the Yukon district, can I go?

Yes. British Columbia adjoins Western Canada, with a main line of railway running clear through it to the coast, and several branches, and lines of steamboats in the interior lakes, to get into the heart of the country.

How do I get to the Kootenay Valleys and the mining districts about them?

The Canadian Pacific Railway runs to Revelstoke, in the Rocky Mountains, and from there you can go down the Arrow Lakes by boat to Nelson, or to Rossland, or to any of the mining camps in West Kootenay. A few hours' journey to the east of Revelstoke is the village of Golden, in the mountains, and here you can make connection with boat for the mines in East Kootenay.

Can I get miners' supplies at these places?

Yes, or at Nelson or Rossland.
