

Forest Fires in Wisconsin. Milwaukee, Wis., Sept. 30,-Reports re-ceived at the railroad office in this city are to the effect that the forest fires in the northern part of the state were quenched by a heavy fall of rain last night. The heaviest loss was suffered at Cumber-land, where 25 families were rendered homeless by the flames and a large sawmill plant valued at \$225,000 was wiped out. Wires are down in all directions and par-ticulars of the ruin wrought have not yet been received, but are expected to come in shorily.




