Mr. Meredith replied that at the expiration of the street railway franchise in 1925, the city can assume ownership upon the required notice being given, and that should it not then avail itself of the opportunity, it can do so at the end of any fifth year thereafter. The city cannot acquire the gas company without special legislation to empower it to raise money for the purpose. Mr. Meredith further stated that under the act passed at the last session of the Legislature, the city can enter into a contract with the commission for power for the city without expropriating the property of the electric light company. The London Electric's franchise is not exclusive. The act of Legslature provides that any bargain made between the city and the commission must be approved by the electors. Whether the act enables the city to supply power to the street railway is questionable. As to the practical necessity of using the present power-house of the London Electric Company or the street railway to supply citizens with light and power from Niagara, Mr. Meredith referred the committee to the engineer.
