CHICAGO, July 28.—Street car employees tonight voted to strike at 4 a.m. tomorrow after refusing to ratify an agreement reached early in the day between representatives of the employees. The agreement, representatives of both parties had thought, would avert a walkout of the men. The walkout, which will affect both the surface and elevated employees, will tie up the transportation system of the city, except suburban lines.

The agreement which was refused at a meeting tonight of the employees would have given the men a wage of 65 cents an hour, their present wage being 48 cents; they would have had an eight-hour day and were to be paid time and a half overtime.


