## IS LABOR PLEA

**British Labor Party Suggests** Irish Assembly To Form Constitution.

LONDON, Dec. 29 .- A movement calculated by its organizers to place the full weight of British organized labor 11 support of the Irish self determination claims began with a specially convened conference of the parliamentary labor party in London today, after which several members of the party's com mission which investigated the situamission which investigated the situa-tion in Ireland told of what they had Hun Had Watch

tion in Ireland told of what they had observed and learned there.

A resolution was adopted unanimously challenging the government to disprove the commission's accusations regarding reprisals and other outrages charged to the crown forces. The conference was held as a curtain raiser for a campaign in behalf of self determination, and in opposition to the government's alleged policy of repression to be inaugurated by the laborites in Manchester on January 17, and concluded in London on February 15.

A. G. Cameron, chairman of today's conference, in opening the lengthy discussion on the inquiry commission's report, characterized it as the most "serious indictment against British methods in trying to govern Ireland ever placed before the British people." The speaker declared: "The manner in which Sir Hamar Greenwood (chief secretary for Ireland), has evaded questronted temperat rejects.

Mr. Cameron added: "As a result of her handling of the Irish question, Great Britain has not a friend in the world."

Approves Declaration.

Another resolution adopted by a large majority at this afternoon's session of the conference voices approval of the parliamentary Labor party's declaration regarding "outrages conducted in the name of the Sinn Fein and reprisals by servants of the crown."

It expresses satisfaction with the efforts of the Labor party inquiry commission to secure a cessation of all mission to secure a cessation of all violent and provocative actions with a view to opening peace negotiations between the Government and elected representatives of the Irish people.

This resolution suggests the following ground as a possible basis for negotiations and settlement of the letch difficulties:

## To Renew Rum War

WASHINGTON. Dec. 29 .- Renewed efforts to check illegal sales of iquor in the United States will form part of the new year resolutions of Prohibition Commissioner Kramer, who announced today plans for reducing the number of federal permits for the handling of liquor in the next twelve months. It is intended to discontinue from 50 to 75 per cent of the existing wholesale licenses, and to curtail retail licenses

According to the commissioner, greatest trouble in enforcing the dry laws has been experienced in the Great Lakes cities and all border points, both Canadian and Mexican. The Atlantic seaboard has also been a tough proposition for the "dry" officers.

It is believed that reduction of the number of wholesale licenses will assist in enforcement of the law in these regions.


