Mr. Justice Moss has given judgment brought by the Welsbach Incandescent Light Company, against Stannard, Mair and Christie. The defendants are ap-

Receipts of wheat at Liverpool the past three days were 291,000 centals, including 226,000 centals of American. Corn, same time, 135,000 centals.

A cable from Liverpool says: The cattle trade is slow; States cattle sell at 5%d per lb.; Canadians at 5¼d and Argentines at 5d. The demand for sheep is fair; States sheep fetch 5½d per lb.; lambs, 6½d; Argentines 6d per lb.

It is generally conceded that the French crop is 61,000,000 bushels short, but as France has an import duty of 36.8c per bushel, prices there will have to advance about 7c to make it profitable to import foreign wheat. France is the largest consumer, outside of England, in Europe, Frenchmen are big speculators, and they took the buying side of futures at the start, but resold later at lower prices.
