endowments for the support of their clergy, and the Committee beg leave again to call the attention of the Society to the expediency of a general effort in order to secure to each parish endowment sufficient to meet at least one-third of the salary of their clergyman.

The sum of £25 has been paid towards liquidating the debt upon the parsonage at Sydney, C. B.; the parishioners making up £75 to meet the grant from the Society.
