

# 7 YEAR OLD LAD RUN OVER BY AUTO AND LOSES LIFE

Douglas Fudger Struck by  
Car Driven by Harold  
Broderick.

Douglas Fudger, the seven-year-old son of Mr. and Mrs. R. D. Fudger, 131 Westworth street, was run over and killed by an automobile driven by William Harold Broderick, son of Dr. E. J. Broderick, in Duke street, yesterday afternoon about 5:30 o'clock. The driver of the car was held at police headquarters for a few hours last evening, but was released late by Coroner H. A. Porter on his own recognizance and in that of his father, to appear at an inquest to be held in the Court House tomorrow evening at 7:30 o'clock. The little boy died a short time after being admitted to the hospital.

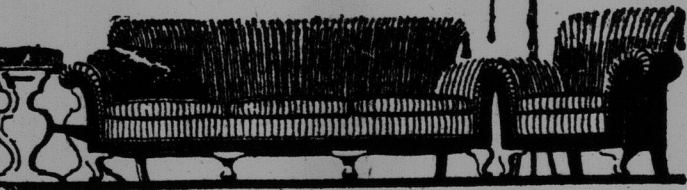
