

Some of the smaller dealers, however, on being able to obtain immediate delivery from the mines had rescribed to the practice of securing what they could through fuel brokers at somewhat fancy prices. This accounted for the fact that in some instances coal was being sold here as high as \$18 or more a ton. Unless Toronto decided to appoint a fuel controller to fix prices, there was nothing to prevent this, selling of "brokerage" coal at the nigher price, although the dealer so doing probably secured no greater margin of profit than those who were able to obtain the fuel direct from the mines at the regular fixed figure and sell at the standard price here.
