Detroit, Feb. 22—Fourteen deaths from alcoholism have been recorded here alcoholism have been recorded here since January I, according to Dr. J. E. Burgess, coroner. This record compares with twenty-seven for the entire year light twenty-seven for the entire year mine, the coroner said, the deaths were mine, the coroner said, the deaths were caused by low grades of illicit liquor, with the method of which had been found to contain fifty per cent of raw alcohol.

In addition to these deaths, Dr. Burgess said, Dr. John E. Clark, county chemist, now has for analysis stomachs of five persons believed by the officials to have died from alcoholic poisoning.
