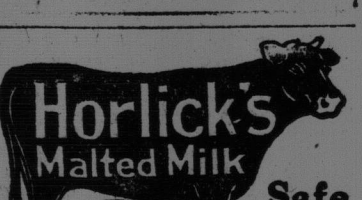

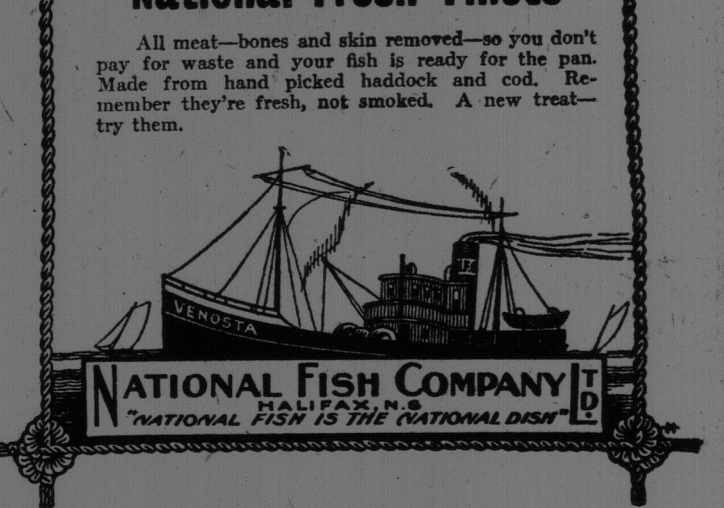
## Bluenose Broilers By Mrs. Doane
