

SMELTERS ARE ACTIVE, STRONG AT MONTREAL

Up 2 1/4 Points, Turnover of More Than Thousand Shares Realized.

STOCK PRICES JUMP AS WALL ST. OPENS

Resistance to Selling Pressure Yesterday Restores Confidence.

Canadian Press. MONTREAL, Jan. 9.—Consolidated Smelters was the active and strong feature at the opening of today's stock market rising 2 1/4 and having a turnover of more than 1,000 shares. Another strong stock was Wayagamack, which was up 1 1/2 at 70 1/2. Brazilian next to Smelters in activity was off 3/8 at 8 1/2, while Western Grocers sold down 1/2 to 9 1/2. There were no other price changes worth mentioning, the following issues selling unchanged: Asbestos preferred, National Breweries, Quebec Power, Montreal Power, and Canadian Car preferred.


