"CLOSED SHOP" A POLITE NAME FOR MONOPOLY
(R. Fulton Cutting in "The Review").

The question of the "closed shop" is today occupying so much attention that it is venture to refer to a phrase of it which does not seem to be generally understood.

The principle which underlies it has appeared in commerce, industry, science, politics, society, and organized religion from the dawn of civilization and has, I think, invariably resulted in the moral deterioration of those who have victoriously employed it.

We call this principle by all sorts of names—monopoly, closed shop, old

school, autocracy, the machine, orthodoxy, conventionality, etc.—but its objective is identical in every field of activity and it invariably means the subordination of the many to the few and the measurable demoralization of the latter.

In industry it is known as "closed shop" and its intention is the reservation to a limited number of the opportunities of employment. It creates an artificial stability to tenure of position which begets indifference and carelessness among those who are protected in employment by it.

PARAVANES SAVED \$800,000,000


London, Eng., Oct. 20.—The protective paravanes with which ships were equipped during the latter stage of the war saved \$800,000,000 worth of British ships from mines and torpedoes. It has just been announced by R. F. McKay. More than 2,700 British vessels were equipped with paravanes, which were as useful for offensive purposes as defensive. The paravanes were charged with as much as 500 pounds of T. N. T. and were towed underneath the water, so that they could not be seen by chance U-boat observers.

\$4,000,000 TO REVEAL NAME

New York, Oct. 20.—The mysterious "Mr. Smith" who gave \$100,000 to the Massachusetts Institute of Technology, has agreed to reveal his name, along with an additional gift of \$4,000,000 if another \$4,000,000 has been raised by the Institute by January 1, 1920.

MORNING NEWS OVER THE WIRES

The crew of the British schooner *Ontario*, picked up at sea by the American steamer *Virley*, and charged by the captain of that vessel with mutiny, were released on Saturday in Philadelphia, where they had been taken in irons. An enquiry was conducted by the British consular officer and the charges of mutiny and of killing the captain and mate were not supported by evidence. It being shown that the two men had been killed by shifting cargo.

The American gunboat *Eagle*, No. 41, has been reported in a disabled condition off Cape Sable, N. S., and two lugs have been sent to her assistance.

Eighty-two children and eight adults were confirmed yesterday in St. Dunstan's church, Fredericton, by His Lordship Bishop LeBlanc.

A Cologne despatch says that Germany has made payment of her first instalment, twenty billion marks, to the Allies.

Moromet, a Prussian territory of about eleven miles, a half square, has been annexed by Belgium on authority of the peace treaty.

The American tug *Acushnet* reached Halifax yesterday with members of the crew of the steamer *Ammonoosuc*, which became disabled and the crew were compelled to take to the boats when she started to sink, after many hours of struggle by the crew of another steamer, the *Isaquena*, to rescue them. The *Isaquena* picked up the rest, while their ship is supposed to have sunk.

IMPORTANT WEEK IN PARLIAMENT

Grand Trunk Bill and Prohibition Measure—Matter of Soldier Gratuities

Montreal, Oct. 20.—A despatch to the Montreal Gazette from Ottawa says: The more sanguine of the common-lawyers believe that the session will be carried into next week. It is expected that with considerable opposition in the senate, the bill will be passed on Wednesday and the senate two days afterwards.

Even with the bill becoming law this session, it will be nearly a year before complete absorption is obtained, as the arbitration proceedings are expected to be long and intricate.

The bill providing for extending the Canada Temperance Act from municipal to provincial scope will also be proceeded with at this session. The bill will pass the commons, but may meet with considerable opposition in the senate. The government has decided to make it law at once if the second chamber does not block the measure.

On Tuesday the committee on soldiers' civil re-establishment will make their report. It is certain that the demand of the increased gratuities will be refused, but there will be recommendations for the betterment of dependents.

Returning to the house he was explaining to the family how the automatic worked, as he had not removed all the cartridges, as he thought he had. The revolver went off, the bullet passing through his head, killing him instantly. He leaves a young wife.

IMPORTANT DEAL IN CANADIAN THEATRE

It has been announced from New York that a syndicate of Montreal capitalists have secured possession of a chain of theatres from Montreal to the Pacific coast, will make Canadian productions, establish a theatre in London and bring British productions to Canada. The Montreal Star adds that the interest taken over include the entire holdings of A. J. Small, including six theatres in Ontario; the booking offices of A. J. Small, which embrace the direction of sixty theatres east of Winnipeg, and that negotiations are in progress to secure control of the Walker theatres in Winnipeg and the entire theatre holdings of Sir James Loughridge in the western provinces. The syndicate also plans to build a new theatre in Vancouver.
