Stockholm, Jan. 10.-At a meeting Stockholm Conference the following resolution was unanimously passed: "The Russian, Swedish and Norwegian members of the Organizing Committee of the Stockholm Conference send to the organized workers of Great Britain their brotherly greetings.
We are glad to receive the invitation to the Conference, at Nottingham, and we are sending our Secretary, Camille Huysmanns, to lay down there the views of the organizers of the Stockholm Conference, these having during several months been in contact with Socialist parties all over
the world, and being thus able to the world, and being thus able to of the working class as a whole. "The organizers of the Stockholm

Conference have a right to claim now that events have confirmed the vie of the situation wher ment took shape and was brought mevt because of the Russion revolu tion, but it was in reality the transformation into action of the decisions taken at the International Congresses at Stuttgart in 1907 and at Copenhagen in 1910, which decisions at the time were supported even by British work-

"From the very beginning Stockholm understood that the Russian revolution, which is a revolution for the whole world, could not conclude its work without very severe internal conflicts if it could not within a short time secure an honorable peace. The summoning of the International at Stockholm would have brought to the Russian working class the unity and power which it needed to escape the dangers of separate action and to carry on the fight for a general peace
