

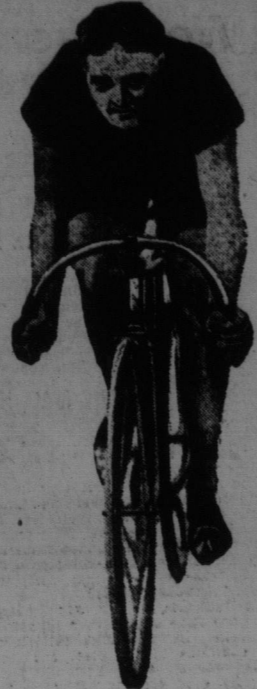

Frank Kramer, American Sprint Champion, Kramer and His Team Mate, James Moran are Possible Winners. New York, Dec. 10.—Fifteen teams, including star bicycle riders of seven countries were in readiness tonight, to start at midnight on a pedalling grind for six days—or 142 hours to be exact. The peculiar contest has survived so many years, that it has long been regarded as an annual feature, but it is said that this may be the last event of the kind seen in New York, at Madison Square Garden where the contest has been held for many years, it is to be torn down soon. There are seventeen eastern riders in this year's lineup, and four from San Francisco. A conspicuous omission in the entries is the name of Walter Rutt, the great German sprinter. In his place Willie Lorenz, the present sprinting champion of Germany has come and will have as a mate Karl Saldor, of Germany. This pair won the recent international six-day race in Berlin, and the team will be one of those most closely watched in the present contest.

**PROVINCIAL CURLERS TO PLAY SCOTS**

White plans are not yet complete, it is likely that the visit of the Scottish curlers will be made the occasion of a regular provincial bonspiel which will be held in this city. Owing to the length of their tour and the limited time at their disposal, together with the great area which it would be necessary to cover if the visitors were to play games in all the Canadian rinks, it will probably be made the rule that they will visit but one or two centres in each province and the various clubs of the province will assemble there to give the Scotsmen a brush with the "stones". St. John will be the only point touched in this province so the local side clubs will come here for the occasion. It is likely that Montreal, Fredericton, Sussex, Hampton, Woodstock, Campbellton, Chatham, and Newcastle will send one or two rinks each to this city when the Scottish curlers are here and games will be played on the city rinks morning, afternoon and evening, with a grand entertainment tendered by the curlers to the Scottish curlers together with the representatives of the provincial rinks. Montreal has already decided to send two rinks and the other towns will be heard from later. It is expected that the visit of the curlers from the land of the thistle will be a grand event in the history of curling in this province.
