The counsel for the defence objected to he form of indictment, it not appearing that the offence was committed within the jurisdiction of a Court sitting in and for the City and County of St. John. The Attorney General contended that under the 15th section of the Criminal Procedure Act of Canada it was not neces sary to state the place or district in which the offence is said to have been committed,

It is true, he said, that in the forms of indictment given in the Dominion Statutes the place or district is set forth at full length but he contended that these forms did not override the enacting clauses of the Act.
