Country Gentlemen, gives the following as is experience with hay mows : Ventilating large bodies of hav is not ften practiced, and results in mow-heated hay, when it is not thoroughly cured. In the summer of 1861, I filled a bay thirtyfour by twenty-two feet, and 18 feet high as I supposed, well cured. Soon after it was filled, I had occasion to visit the mow and found that a large amount of steam or por was rising from the hay- I took a w knife and cut two round holes, four of in diameter and five feet deep, which when done had the appearance of an escape pipe from a steam-boiler. The work of subsided in a few days, and the hay came at bright. Last year I constructed a venfor in the same bay, of four scantling rounds two and a half feet long and nches apart, and placed in the cenre of the bay, over a hole in the floor consided ladder. 
