*To explain a certain Act therein-
mentioned, relating to voluntary
Sheriffs' Sales (Décrêts Volon-
taires).*

WHEREAS doubts might arise upon the fifth, sixth and seventh Clauses or Sections of an Act passed in the third year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "An Act to render "Voluntary Sheriffs' Sales, (*Décrêts Volontaires*), more easy and less expensive"—Now, therefore, to remove all doubts, be it enacted by the King's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of the Province of Lower-Canada, constituted and assembled by virtue of and under the authority of an Act passed in the Parliament of Great-Britain, intituled, "An Act to repeal certain parts of an Act "passed in the fourteenth year of His Majesty's Reign, intituled, "*An Act for making more effectual provision for the Govern-
ment of the Province of Quebec in North-
America*, and to make further provision for "the Government of the said Province;"—And it is hereby declared and enacted by the authority of the same, that the Sheriffs, in cases of Voluntary Sheriffs' Sales, (*Décrêts Volontaires*) shall not be entitled to any commission upon any opposition *afin de conserver*, except upon the amount, or upon any such part thereof, as shall be adjudged to the Opposant by judgement of the Court before which the cause (*instance*) wherein the opposition is fyled, shall have been brought.

II. And be it further declared and enacted by the authority aforesaid, that in no case shall the *Adjudicataire* be held to give security to any greater amount than that for which he shall have become *Adjudicataire* of the property seized and sold by Voluntary Sheriff's Sale, (*Décrét Volontaire*).
