

## 31 VIC., CHAP. 77.

An Act to enable Her Majesty to provide for the Widow and Children of the late Honorable Thomas D'Arcy McGee.

[Assented to 22nd May, 1868.]

Most Gracious Sovereign:

XX E, Your Majesty's dutiful and loyal subjects, the Com- Preamble. mons of Canada in Parliament assembled, having taken into consideration the message of His Excellency the Governor General, bearing date the fourteenth day of April, in the year of Our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, wherein His Excellency is pleased to state, that being deeply impressed with the severe loss which the country has sustained, in consequence of the murder of the Honorable Thomas D'Arcy McGee, and being desirous of marking his sense of the public and private virtues of Mr. McGee, and of affording relief and assistance to his afflicted family, His Excellency recommends to the House of Commons to enable him to make such provision for the widow and family of the Honorable Thomas D'Arcy McGee, as to the liberality of Parliament may seem proper, and having resolved to grant to Your Majesty the sums hereinafter mentioned, to enable Your Majesty to make the provision recommended by His Excellency's message, do most humbly beseech Your Majesty that it may be enacted, and be it enacted, by the Queen's Most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Senate and House of Commons of Canada, that—

1. An annuity or yearly sum of twelve hundred dollars Annuity to of lawful money of Canada, shall be issued and payable out the widow of the Hon. T. of and charged and chargeable upon the Consolidated D. McGee. Revenue Fund of Canada, free and clear of all taxes and deductions to Mary Theresa McGee, the widow of the said Thomas D'Arcy McGee, for and during the natural life of the said Mary Theresa McGee, which annuity shall commence from the seventh day of April, in the year of our Lord, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and the first payment on account of the same shall be computed from the seventh day of April to the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, and from
