Sir,

In conformity with your letter of March the 23rd last, file 410923, I enclose herewith the Surrender of the Merchable timber on the Weymontachingne Reserve, which has been unanimously voted and signed by the 19 members of that band present at the meeting. After having given duly notice a month before, this meeting was held in the house of the Chief, Louis Petigay, on the Weymontachingne Reserve, at 10 o'clock A. M., the second day of July, in my presence as well as before three gentlemen who were invited by the Chief and who have signed the Surrender as witnesses.

The total number of Indians aged 21 years and over belonging to this band is 27 - On this number 19 were present at the meeting and all signed the Surrender. The eight others had gone away to the bush after live foxes -

Enclosed are also my affidavit and that of Chief Petigay as required, as well as other documents which may be useful to your Department.

I will send a full and detailed report of my trip by next mail.
