Dear Mr. Meighen:

With the return of the attached correspondence concerning Lieutenant Harold K. Cox, I wanted to let you know that the case has again been very carefully reviewed by the Board of Pension Commissioners in Ottawa.

In order that all medical opinion may be heard and that the case may be investigated by both sides, it has been arranged that Mr. Cox should appear personally in Toronto before a quorum of the Board of Pension Commissioners. May I suggest that when this meeting is arranged, Mr. Cox should have Dr. Goldsmith appear with him and also Dr. Crompton, if such is possible.

To my mind this is the fairest way of arriving at a proper diagnosis and proper assessment of this case and arrangements are being made for this hearing at the earliest possible date.
