Resolved, That this House do agree to the said amendment, and that the Clerk do carry the Bill back to the Council and acquaint them therewith.

An engrossed Bill to impose Duties on certain Importations, was read a third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass, and that the Title be, An Ast to impose Duties on certain Importations.

An engroffed Bill to revive, continue and amend, an Act to provide for the support of a Light House at the South end of Comn's Island at Liverpool, was read a third time.

Resolved, That the Bill do pass and that the title be, An Act to revive, continue and amend, an Act to provide for the support of a Light-House at the South end of Cossin's Mand, on the Eastern side of the entrance of Liverpool Harbour.

Ordered, That the Clerk do carry the Bills to the Council, and defire their con-

currence.

On motion of Mr. Archibald, Resolved, That a Committee be appointed to prepare an Address to His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, to request that His Excellency will be pleased to transmit the Ast relating to Marriages and the Issuing of Marriage Licences, to His Majesty's Ministers, for the favorable consideration of His Royal Highness the Prince Regent.

Ordered, That Mr. Haliburton, Mr. Cogswell, and Mr. Prescott, be a Committee for

the above purpose.

Mr. Archibald reported from the Committee appointed to wait upon His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor, with the Address of this House, and the several Resolutions relative to His Excellency's several Messages to this House, that the Committee had waited upon His Excellency with the said Address and the several Resolutions, pursuant to the Order of the House, and that His Excellency was pleased to say, that he could not then give an answer to the Address, and the several Resolutions, but that he would take an early opportunity of communicating it to the House in person.

A Message from His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor, by Mr. Secretary George : Mr. Speaker,

His Excellency commands this Flouse to attend His Excellency immediately in the Council Chamber.

Accordingly, Mr. Speaker with the House attended his Excellency in the Council Chamber.

And being returned,

Mr. Speaker reported that the House had attended His Encellency in the Council Chamber, where His Excellency was pleased to give His Assent to the several Bills sollowing, Viz:

An Act to alter and amend an Act, made and passed in the third and fourth years of this present Majesty's reign, entitled, An Act to enable the Inhabitants of the several

Townships within the Province, to maintain their Poor.

An Act to repeal an Act, passed in the fifty-third year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act in addition to, and amendment of, an Act, passed in the third and fourth years of His present Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act for the relief of Insolvent Debtors.

An Act to continue the several Acts of the General Assembly now in force relating to

a Militia, and in further amendment and alteration of the fame.

An A& to preferve and regulate the Navigation of the Harbour of Picton. ?

An Act in addition to, and amendment of, an Act passed in the thirty-third year of His Majesty's Reign, entitled, An Act to enable the Inhabitants of the Town of Annapolis, and the Officers of His Majesty's Carrison stationed for the time being in the said Town of Annapolis.
